

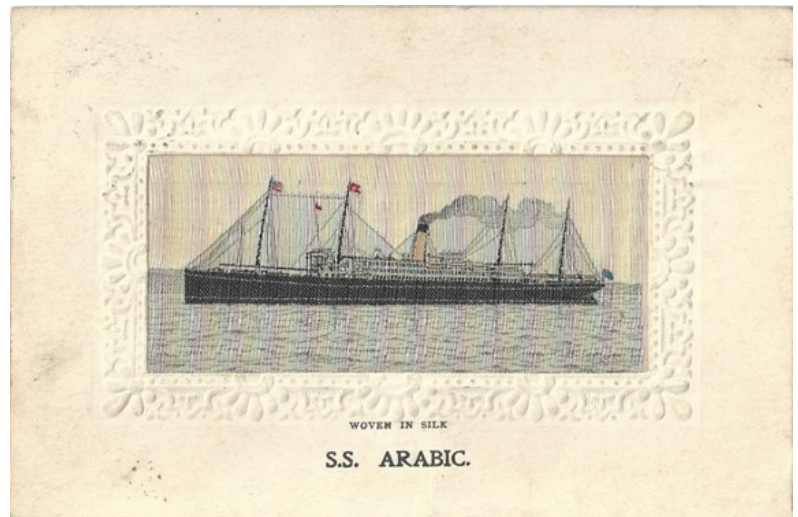
Cover Story - Secrets of a Postcard

I collect volumes of ephemera about ocean liners, including postcards. Many postcards. And some of them have information and cancellations on the back that is just as interesting as the ocean liner image on the front.

This postcard of the White Star Line's *Arabic* (Figure 1) is a prime example of the information that can be gleaned from a postcard.

The sender could have enclosed it in a White Star Line envelope which would have been in the stationery in their cabin on board, but in a possible show of disdain for the cost of the expensive card they took their chances with the postal system. This is a 'circle' of friends that didn't seem to worry about mon-



ey.

Many postcards of the era sent from foreign lands succumbed to stamp collectors, (Continued on page 3)

Introduction to...Collecting U.S. Precancels

Precanceled postage stamps are defined as stamps that have been canceled before being affixed to an envelope or mail matter. The reason for the practice is to save time. Somewhere along the way, someone realized that canceling 100 stamps in a sheet was quicker than cancelling them 1 at a time. So, precanceled stamps were made available to large companies that did a lot of mailing, such as mail order companies like the one who put out the SEEDS catalogue for farmers.

The U.S. Post Office offered these precancels at a slightly lower postage rate known as a 'discount rate', and in the United States, precancels are often (Continued on page 10)

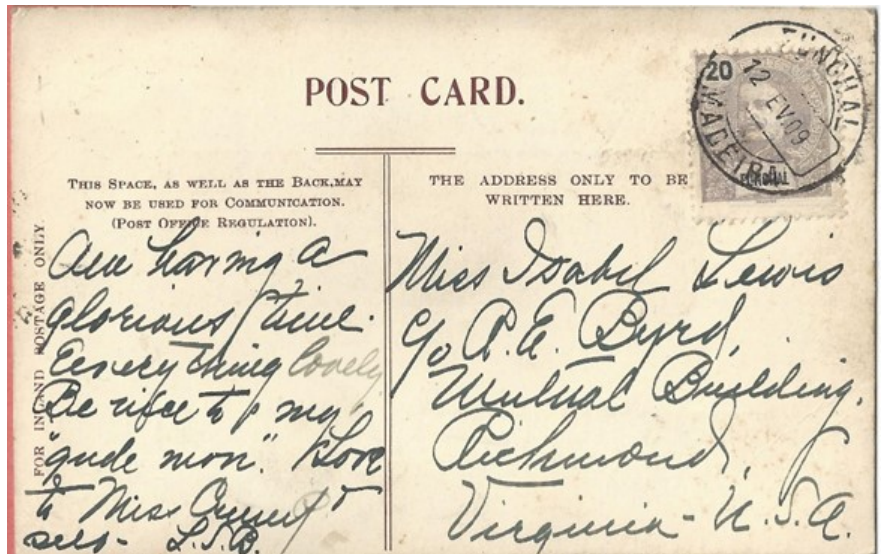

who peeled the stamp off the back of the card to add it to their stamp collection. This Portuguese stamp is unmolested (Figure 2). And it has a very clear cancellation. Even more important it is officially over-printed for exclusive use in Funchal, the capital city of the autonomous Portuguese region of Madeira. For any stamp collector recipient, a FUNCHAL over-print stamp would have been a rare and welcomed acquisition.

But who were the recipients? Two names are shown. There's Miss Isabel Lewis, in care of R.E. Byrd, in Richmond, Virginia. It appears that the sender didn't know Miss Lewis' address. But she (who asks for care of her 'gude mon') does know how to contact R.E. Byrd.

Does the name 'R.E. Byrd' ring a bell with you, the reader? It did with me. It's Richard E. Byrd, the famous Antarctic explorer whom we would have recognized if it had said 'Rear Admi-

ral Richard E. Byrd'. Byrd was born in 1888 in Virginia, the son of one of the British founding families of Virginia, and so would have been only 19 years old at this time. His father had the same name, but in that era it would be more likely that it would be the son who was in contact with unmarried and apparently trendy young women. There's one question that this card cannot answer: Where has it been all these years?

used for 3rd class & 4th class mail, such brochures, flyers etc.

In the 1930s, the Post Office added town names to track where the precancels were being sent from. The biggest mailers at the time were Sears/Roebuck and Montgomery/Ward, who both sent catalogues across the country hoping to increase sales and orders from outlying areas that had very little population.

There are 2 types of precancels, Bureau & Town & Types. Bureau precancels are printed at the Bureau of Engraving & Printing in Washington D. C.. The practice became common around 1923, with denominations of 1 cent to 10 cent stamps done by rotary press. The number has grown steadily to a total of nearly 9,500 different precancels issued in denominations of ½ cent to \$1.00 values. Bureau precancels are identified by Scott Catalog Number & the Precancel Style Number.

From the 1930s to the 1950s, when mailing catalogues, various companies would purchase pre-paid stamps from the Bureau (*Cont'd on page 4*) and have their initials printed across the top of the stamp. These included M.W.C., which stood for Montgomery/ Ward, and also S.R.C. which stood for Sears, Roebuck Catalogs. Sometimes, the months and years were added.

With Town precancels, the scope and ways to collect them are almost unlimited. Some ideas include collecting a single City or State, or a specific series of stamps (such as Presidential, War & Defense, Liberty series). You can also collect 3, 4, or 5-letter towns from the various states; possibly concentrating on a particular series such as the 8 cent Liberty stamp, 1930 Presidential series, 1 ¼ Gallatin issue.

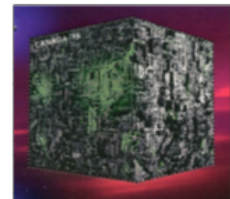

Combining Philately and Astronomy

Besides being interested in philately I am also interested in astronomy and often these interests blend. My interest in astronomy and science began when my parents took me to the Brussels' planetarium when I was 12. (Fig 1). November 11 this year offers us an extra activity beyond remembering our fallen Canadians. On the morning of Monday November 11 the planet Mercury will transit (meaning cross in front of) the sun. The event for our locality will begin at 7:35 am EST and will end more or less six hours later. Remember not to look directly, or through a telescope at the sun, as you will burn your retina. Set up a pinhole projection system. See this NASA video for a simple how-to: <https://svs.gsfc.nasa.gov/12638>

Transits are very important to astronomy as they allow a refining of various measurements such as the distance to the sun known as an astronomical unit (AU), diameters of solar bodies and more. And

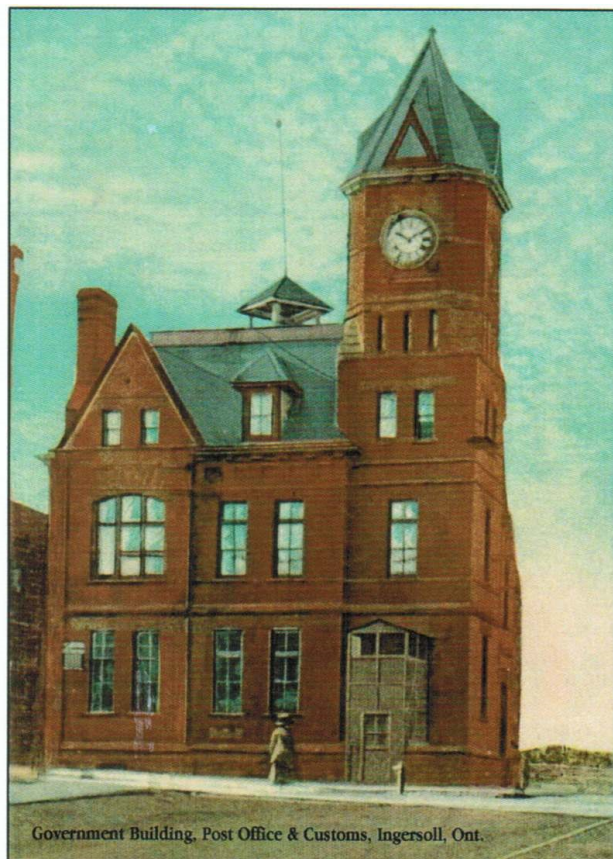

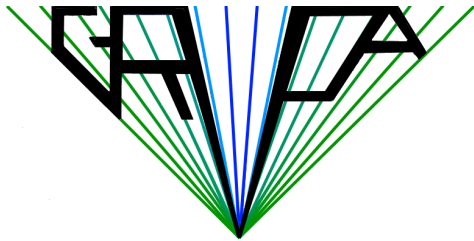
